

ROAD WORKS, COODE ST SUBWAY CLOSURES AND 24/7 WORKS

In order to complete essential road and bridge works, there will be a number of road and traffic impacts to Coode-King William Street and Whatley Crescent from now until September.

These road works were originally scheduled later in the project but have been brought forward to optimise the construction program and reduce the overall number of road closures. Due to this resequencing, the new Beechboro Road South connection will now open in September.

The southern platforms of the New Bayswater Station are still expected to open in September.

Works planned include:

- install columns, headstocks and beams on the northern bridges
- install drainage tanks beneath Coode St to mitigate future flooding
- upgrading the King William/Whatley Crescent intersection including raising the road level, traffic signalling, water main installation and asphaltting to tie into the new Beechboro South Road
- build the new Beechboro South Road link.

Coode Street subway closures and 24/7 works

When:

- 8pm to 5am Sunday 16 July and Monday 17 July (overnight closures)
- 8pm Thursday 20 July to 5am Friday 28 July.

Where (*see map overleaf*):

- Coode Street subway closed between Whatley Crescent and Railway Parade
- Coode Street closed between Broun Avenue and Beaufort Street
- Coode Street local traffic only between Beaufort Street and Railway Parade.

What to expect:

- Coode Street subway closed. Pedestrians and cyclists – use Leake Street underpass.
- 24/7 works as some works must take place out-of-hours while trains are not running and for the safety of the public and workforce.
- Construction impacts such as noise, dust, vibration and light spillage as well as heavy vehicles, machinery and workers accessing local roads and the construction site.
- Local businesses remain open and access will be maintained at all times. We're working with the business community to minimise impacts and support them during this time.
- Midland and Airport lines shut from Friday 14 July to Sunday 16 July and Sunday 23 to safely install bridge beams. Rail replacement buses 901 and 902 are available from Meltham Station.
- Deviations to bus routes 48, 998, 999 and rail replacement buses 901 and 902 – refer to local bus network map overleaf or visit transperth.wa.gov.au to plan your journey.
- Changed traffic conditions including road closures and detours - please follow signage.

Road works (end-July to September)

From end-July until September, extensive road works will take place on Coode Street and Whatley Crescent. The road will remain open to motorists, pedestrians and cyclists under traffic management, with some turning restrictions and lane closures on Whatley Crescent. More information on these changing traffic conditions will be provided closer to the dates.

Wet weather

In the winter months, cold temperatures and wet weather can unfortunately impact the timing of our works. There are certain activities that can only be completed during warm, dry conditions. These include line marking, drainage and asphaltting. Depending on the weather conditions we may need to reschedule some works.

We understand construction impacts may cause some frustration and inconvenience to residents living nearby, and every effort will be made to reduce impacts where possible.
